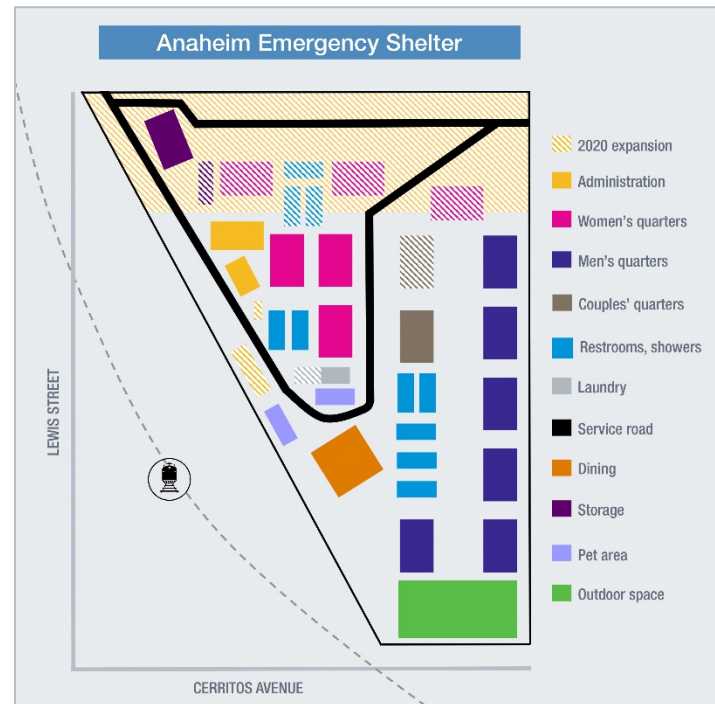
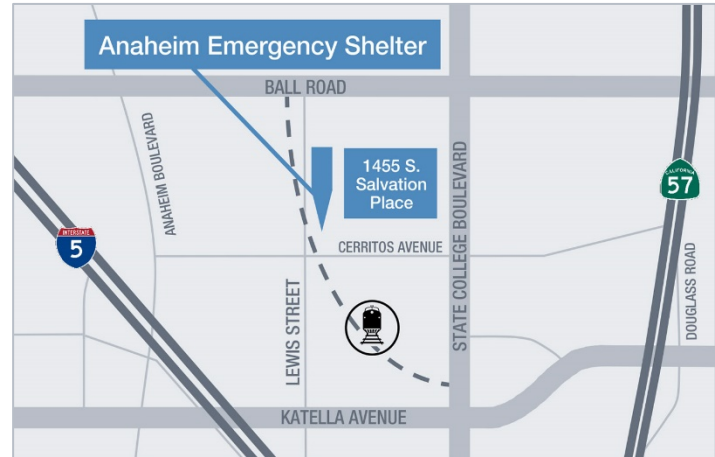




# FactSheet

## Anaheim Emergency Shelter

- **What:** homeless shelter
- **Where:** 1455 S. Salvation Place
- **Beds:** 325
- **Operator:** The Salvation Army Orange County with city of Anaheim funding
- **Opened:** Feb. 1, 2019
- **Expanded:** June 1, 2020  
▶ See 2020 expansion below
- **Site:** 2.8 acres
- **Development, operational cost:** \$16.6 million
- **Funding:** city of Anaheim, state funding grants
- **Location:** industrial area alongside railway just south of Ball Road, north of Cerritos Avenue, next to existing Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center, warehouse, office
- **Design:** modular buildings with men's, women's, couples' living spaces, dining, showers, restrooms, laundry, pet area, storage, recreational space
- **Employees:** 30, including program director, clinicians, case managers, housing navigators, counselors, drivers
- **Security:** Anaheim Police Department and Anaheim security contractor Lyons Security Services Inc.

## Anaheim Emergency Shelter: 2020 expansion

- **What:** addition of 101 beds to Anaheim Emergency shelter, for a total of 325
- **Why:** to address continued need for shelter space; accelerate resources to be provided by Center of Hope
  - ▶ *See Center of Hope fact sheet*
- **Location:** parking lot on north side of current shelter
- **Additions:** 11 modular buildings
  - Four dorms for women, some couples space
  - Three restrooms and showers
  - Two offices
  - Laundry
  - Storage
- **Cost:** \$1.8 million one-time construction, \$1.7 million annually for operation
- **Funding:** city of Anaheim, state grant funds for homelessness
- **City Council action:** Feb. 4, 2020, approval of an operating agreement with Salvation Army and city development and operational funding for expansion
- **Timeline:**
  - **February:** site plan review
  - **March:** initial site work
  - **April-May:** additional shelter space buildout
  - **June:** opened

## Center of Hope

- **What:** proposed Salvation Army homeless care campus offering emergency shelter, supportive housing with services
- **Where:** 1455 S. Salvation Place, 1340 S. Lewis St.
- **Size:**
  - 6.9 acres
  - Five main buildings, 190,000 square feet
  - 325-bed shelter campus
- **Estimated cost:** \$75 million
- **Funding:** state homeless grants, Salvation Army fundraising
- **Location:** industrial area alongside railway just south of Ball Road
- **Developer, owner, operator:** The Salvation Army Orange County
- **Timeline:**
  - **Fundraising:** 2020
  - **Construction:** 2021
  - **Phased opening, ongoing construction:** 2022
- **Phase one shelter:** 325-bed emergency shelter campus, replacing temporary modular building now on southern end of the site
- **Phase one housing:** 100 affordable housing studios
  - 98 resident studios, two for managers
  - All formerly homeless, including those with disabilities
  - Community, group rooms
  - Case management meeting rooms
  - Laundry
  - Courtyard, outdoor areas

## Center of Hope

- **Serving:** homeless families and people referred by Anaheim's outreach workers, the Anaheim Police Department and others dealing with homelessness in the city
- **What's there now:**
  - Anaheim Emergency Shelter, 325 beds
  - 5-acre Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center, a residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation program
    - ▶ *See Adult Rehabilitation Center below*
- **Center of Hope models:**
  - **Salvation Army Bell Shelter** (*lower right*): A former Army base in the city of Bell, the Bell Shelter provides emergency shelter, crisis and transitional housing, permanent supportive apartments, substance abuse treatment, case management, mental health services and more
  - **Center of Hope Men's and Women's Shelter, Sacramento:** Emergency, transitional housing along with counseling, employment help, legal referrals, help connecting with family members, case management, permanent housing placement
  - **Salvation Army Freedom Center Campus, Chicago:** 6-acre campus including Shield of Hope emergency family shelter, Freedom Center with community center, jobs program, health clinic, addiction rehabilitation

## Salvation Army

- **What:** international faith-based charitable group
- **Founded:** 1865
- **Global headquarters:** London
- **U.S. headquarters:** Alexandria, Va.
- **OC headquarters:** Tustin
- **Anaheim operations:**
  - Adult Rehabilitation Center of Orange County
  - Anaheim Red Shield Community Center
  - Family Store and Donation Center
  - Anaheim Temple
- **Homelessness:** runs range of facilities offering emergency shelter and transitional housing with supportive services, including in Santa Ana, Los Angeles and San Diego

## Adult Rehabilitation Center

- **What:** residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation program serving 175 people at 1300 S. Lewis St.
- **Opened:** 1986
- **Program:** six months
- **Cost:** free
- **How it works:** participants work onsite at Salvation Army warehouse handling donated clothes, furniture, other items for Salvation Army Thrift Stores; no drinking, drugs, stealing, fighting, other rule violations
- **Success rate:** 37 percent, high for drug and alcohol rehabilitation
- **Size:** 5 acres, including chapel, basketball court and warehouse
- **Funding:** proceeds from Salvation Army Thrift Stores
- **Going forward:** Adult Rehabilitation Center would continue to operate as part of Center of Hope campus
