



Anaheim Community and Economic Recovery Plan

- **What:** \$35.6 million in city funding and grants for seniors, needy families, workers, renters, businesses and others to address the impacts of coronavirus
 - **\$11.4 million:** homelessness
 - **\$6.5 million:** attracting conventions, visitors
 - **\$5 million:** rental assistance
 - **\$4.8 million:** small business grants, marketing
 - **\$3 million:** nonprofits serving seniors, families and children
 - **\$1.7 million:** housing support
 - **\$1.2 million:** support for workers
 - **\$1 million:** masks, testing and other needs
 - **\$1 million:** internet access rebates

City Funding

- **What:** \$20 million in City Council-directed funding for seniors, families, workers, renters and businesses
- **Community relief:** \$10.5 million
 - **\$4 million:** rental assistance
 - **\$3 million:** nonprofits
 - **\$1.5 million:** homeless assistance
 - **\$1 million:** face coverings, testing, other needs
 - **\$1 million:** internet access rebates
- **Business assistance:** \$9.5 million
 - **\$6.5 million:** booking conventions, attracting visitors
 - **\$2 million:** small business grants
 - **\$1 million:** shop, dine local marketing, support for doing business outdoors
- **Funding:** part of Anaheim's \$33 million in funding from the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act plus additional state, local dollars



City Funding

- City Council action:
 - **March 26, 2020:** \$15 million in funding, including \$8 million for community needs and \$7 million for booking events at Anaheim Convention Center, marketing Anaheim businesses
 - **May 5, 2020:** Reallocation of \$3 million for rental assistance, additional \$1 million to nonprofits
 - **Aug. 11, 2020:** Additional \$4 million for business assistance, nonprofits, masks and testing as needed, local shop and dine marketing, grants to do business outdoors
 - **Sept. 15, 2020:** Approval of Internet Access Rebate Program

Grants

- **What:** \$15.6 million in federal, state and county grants to the city of Anaheim to address impacts of coronavirus
- **Homelessness:** \$9.9 million in Emergency Solutions Grants from federal Housing and Urban Development Department
- **Small-business grants:** \$1.8 million in county funding for small businesses in east Anaheim
- **Housing:** \$1.7 million
 - **\$1.3 million:** housing vouchers from HUD Housing Choice Voucher program
 - **\$368,000:** HUD housing assistance for those living with HIV/AIDS
- **Worker assistance:** \$1.2 million
 - **\$800,000:** federal National Dislocated Worker Grants to reemploy laid off workers
 - **\$450,000:** federal Workforce Innovation Fund Grant for worker training and education
- **Rental assistance:** \$1 million from Community Development Block Grant



Emergency Rental Assistance Program

- **What:** \$5 million program for residents struggling amid the coronavirus crisis to pay back rent deferred under Anaheim's eviction moratorium, or state and federal eviction protections
- **Approved:** May 5, 2020, additional funds added Aug. 11, by Anaheim's City Council as part of the Anaheim Community and Economic Recovery Plan
- **Funding:** federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, money allocated under the Anaheim Community and Economic Recovery Plan
- **Application period:**
 - **First round:** June 1-5, 2020
 - **Second round:** Sept. 30-Oct. 16, 2020
- **First round applicants:** 894
- **Second round applicants:** 552
- **Rental assistance:** up to \$2,100 per household
 - **Back rent repayment:** up to six months help paying back rent deferred since April 2020
 - **Meeting current rent:** up to six months of help at \$700 a month, or, if lower, the difference between 40 percent of current monthly income and rent
 - **Combination:** help for both current and back rent due, up to \$2,100 per household

Take it Outdoors: Restaurant Relief Grant Program

- **What:** grants to Anaheim restaurants for building or expanding outdoor dining space
- **Why:** restaurants still have restrictions on indoor dining, being outdoors has been proven to have less risk for spread of virus
- **Amount:** restaurants can get up to \$2,000 to pay for shade structures or umbrellas, décor, barricades, renting tables and chairs, or other costs
- **When:** grants can be used for future costs or for reimbursement of spending since March 16, 2020
- **Available:** funds are limited, duration of program based on interest
- **Apply:** Anaheim.net/5747/Outdoor-Dining-Grants

Internet Access Rebate

- **What:** assistance for residents impacted by coronavirus crisis for internet service
- **Why:** many residents are experiencing financial hardship due to lost wages and, at the same time, many are working from home or have children doing online learning
- **How:** residents with household income up to \$102,450 for a family of four can get a rebate of up to \$120 through Anaheim Public Utilities
- **Program:** \$1 million, helping up to 8,000 households
- **Available:** Oct. 1, 2020
- **Apply:** Anaheim.net/internet



Mask Giveaways

- **What:** drive-thru mask distribution events hosted by city of Anaheim
- **Why:** masks are a critical part of preventing the spread of coronavirus, especially as we look toward gradual reopening; targeting most impacted neighborhoods
- **When:**
 - Sept. 9, 2020 from 8 a.m. to noon
 - Sept. 16, 2020 from 4 to 8 p.m.
 - Sept. 26, 2020 from 8 a.m. to noon
- **Where:**
 - **Sept. 9:** Magnolia Baptist Church, 720 S. Magnolia Ave.
 - **Sept. 16:** Anaheim First Christian Church, 520 W. South St.
 - **Sept. 26:** Temple Beth Emet, 1770 W. Cerritos Ave.
- **Masks:** 90,500
- **Families served:** handed out 2,262 boxes of 40 masks, one per family
- **How:** federal COVID-19 relief funds allocated by City Council, volunteers
