Question	Answer
<p>Did our Neighborhood Watch Police contact retire? Who is our new contact?</p>	<p>Senior Crime Prevention Specialist Arleen Harris and her replacement Nancy Loewe have both retired. Interim assistance can be found by contacting Rocio Burress at (714) 765-1659 until such time a permanent staff can be hired. Also, you can contact Sergeant Bryan Janocha at (714) 765-3845.</p>
<p>I was a victim of package theft...Amazon replaced the package but should I still report to our Police Department?</p>	<p>Yes, in fact you can report it online. It may not lead to an arrest, but we use these reports for crime statistics and it helps us deploy personnel and know where crimes are occurring in the city. This way we know where to look for the thieves and where to potentially place bait packages.</p>
<p>Will OC San repave curb to curb? When will this repaving be completed? June/July 2021?</p>	<p>Yes, the repaving will be completed by the Orange County Sanitation District in June/July 2021.</p>
<p>What can be done about street racers and their spectators? I know it is a problem all over, but we see it a lot along State College/Ball area close to 57 freeway.</p>	<p>We are constantly monitoring the street racing groups through intelligence methods and social media. We take enforcement action every time we respond to street racing calls, including towing and impounding of vehicles involved in criminal activity. In addition, City Council recently passed an ordinance allowing us to take enforcement action against street racing spectators. The best thing to do is call us (714) 765-1900, and report if you see a group gathering or street racing in progress. We will send patrol officers and the police helicopter when available.</p>

How do I report people having large house parties during COVID restrictions?	Please use Anaheim Anytime or if disturbing is excessive please contact Police Department non-emergency (714) 765-1900 for Police response. Code Enforcement will follow up with the property owner regarding COVID guidelines and restrictions.
How can I request more street lights for my neighborhood?	Please contact Neighborhood Services at (714) 765-4456. We work directly with Anaheim Public Utilities in helping to improve lighting in your neighborhood through upgrades, new lights, repairs, and promoting the Dusk-to-Dawn Lighting Program .
