Classification
APPARATUS REPAIRER

Definition: Under minimal supervision, performs skilled electrical repair of distribution and power transformers and other apparatus in the utilities field shop.

Essential Job Functions:

Inspects, cleans and repairs, tests and paints transformers, regulators, oil switches and capacitors.

Maintains S/C loadbust tool.

Washes and tests rubber gloves and blankets.

Tests electrical tools and extension cords for safe operation.

Prepares records and reports of transformer shop operations.

Performs related duties as required.

Job Related Qualifications:

Experience: Journey level skill as a sub-station electrician or line mechanic, and completion of an approved apprentice-ship program.

Knowledge of: The principles of electrical theory; electrical AC/DC circuits; electrical distribution and power transformers; equipment, tools, materials and methods used in the installation, repair, and maintenance of transformers, capacitors, regulators, oil switches and meters; and electric power specifications, wiring diagrams and blue prints.

Ability to: Establish and maintain effective working relationships; diagnose, locate and repair defective electrical equipment and apparatus, and operate forklifts and cranes.

Physical Requirements: Use both hands, arms and legs, stoop, bend and lift up to 100 pounds.

License and/or Certification Required: Possession of, or ability to obtain a valid California Driver's License by date of appointment.

Supervision Received: Works under the technical supervision of Electric General Supervisor who makes assignments and periodically reviews work.
