Classification:
POLICE PHOTOGRAPHER

DEFINITION: Under general supervision operates and maintains the film processing equipment of the Anaheim Police Department and takes photographs of various police related activities.

TYPICAL DUTIES:

Takes photographs of crime scenes, various evidence including latent prints, documents and other items being examined as requested.

Photographs victims and other subjects as required.

Maintains and operates a photographic mini-lab, photographic equipment and photographic chemistry for the production of photographs in accordance with industry standards.

Processes and prints all film; prints 1:1 photographs for the use of laboratory examinations.

Enlarges and prints photographs and transparencies as requested; maintains files of negatives for reference.

Maintains a current knowledge and technical proficiency in computer technology, digital imaging, videography and advanced photography.

This position performs related duties as required.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Experience: Experience in the operation and maintenance of a photographic mini-lab

Knowledge of: Photographic techniques, digital imaging and videography; manual processing in a standard dark room.

Ability to: Operate a computer and associated software including scanners and printers; use a variety of image analysis software to produce, enhance and reproduce forensic images.

Ability to: Communicate well with other departments and the public; use both hands and legs, climb stairs and ladders, ride in a helicopter, work with photographic chemicals and tolerate adverse conditions.

License Required: Class C California Driver's License.

Supervision Received: Works under direction of Identification Sergeant who outlines assignments and continually reviews work.
