Classification:
ELECTRIC METER TECHNICIAN

DEFINITION: Under moderate supervision performs journey level installation, maintenance, and testing of electric meters, equipment and installations.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

Installs, tests, and services single phase, polyphase, demand meters and metering equipment in the field.

Bench tests meters, transformers and wire metering panels.

Inspects equipment for compliance with codes and regulations.

Cleans, repairs and adjusts meters. Investigates complaints.

Prepares reports on work.

Assists in training meter shop personnel.

Calculates single and polyphase loads.

May remove, install, and service metering equipment in panels energized at 480 volts (normal) and below.

Performs related duties as required.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Experience: Journey level experience as an Electric Meter Technician.

Knowledge of: Basic principles of electricity, current theory, physics and mathematics through trigonometry.

Skill in: Establishing and maintaining effective working relationships and use of trade tools, keeping records, installing, testing and servicing electric meters.

Physical Requirements: Ability to see well, use both hands, arms and legs, stoop, bend and lift.

License Required: Class III California Driver's License.

Supervision Exercised: May direct work of and train Apprentice Electric Meter Technicians, but does not hire, evaluate or discipline.

Supervision Received: Works under the technical supervision of Electric Meter Supervisor who makes assignments and periodically reviews work.

Career Ladder Information: Experience in this class may meet minimum requirements for promotion to Electric Meter Supervisor.

FLSA Designation: Non-Exempt
