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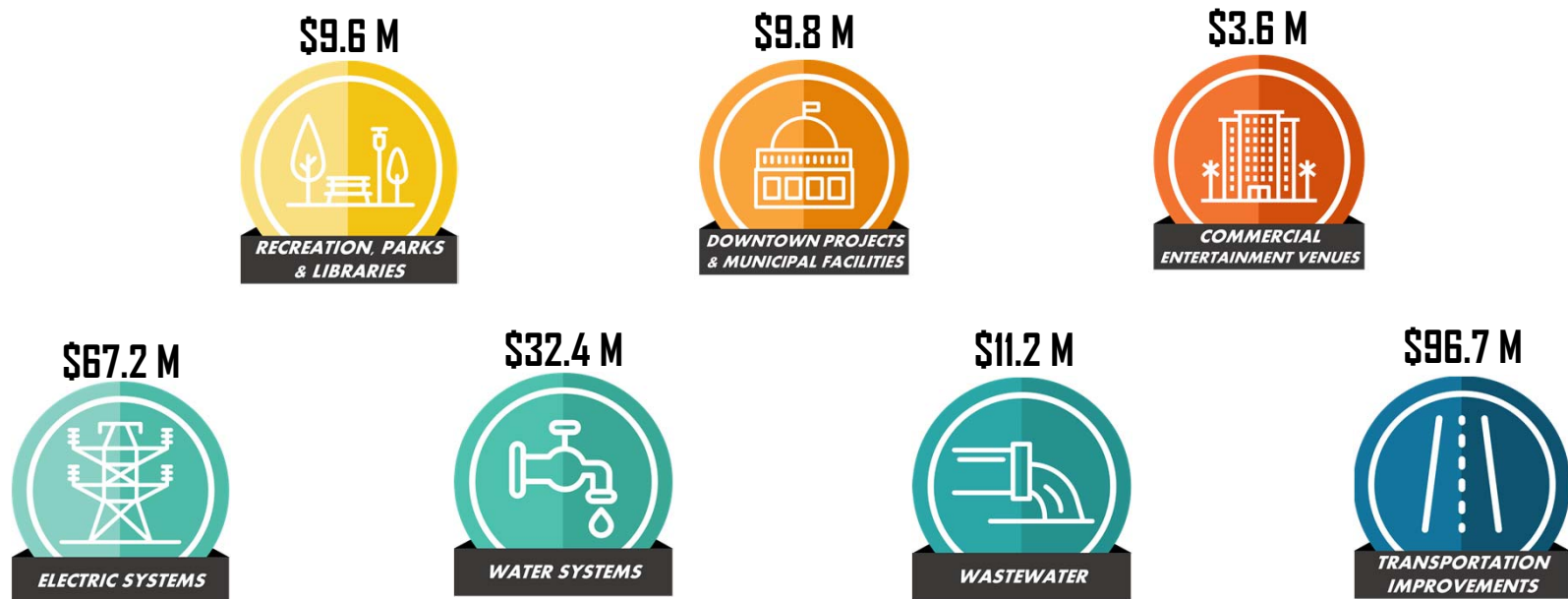

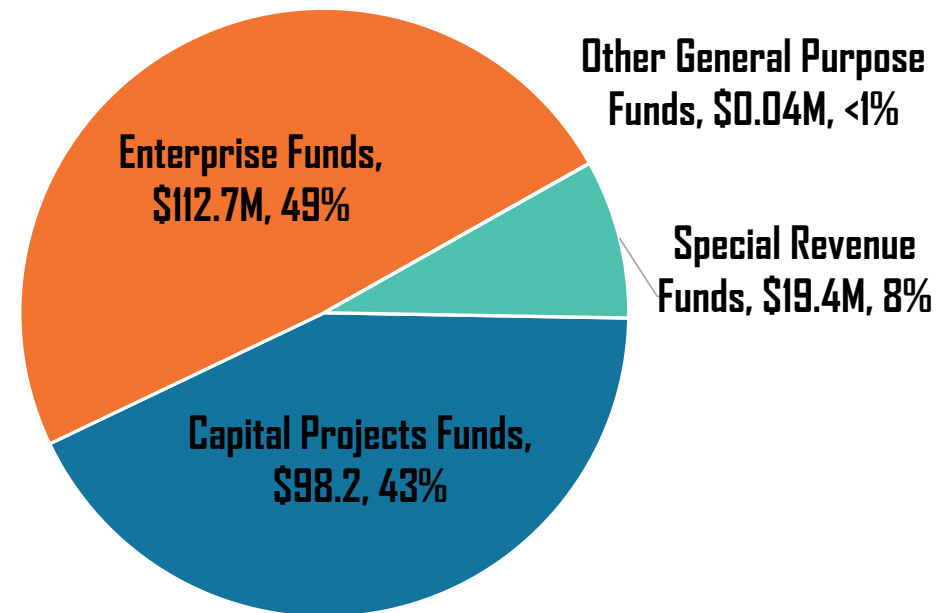

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP)**

The CIP is a fiscal and planning tool that allows Anaheim to allocate budget for capital projects to rehabilitate, improve, and/or build new public infrastructure, for example streets, parks, and libraries.

Capital projects involve major City investments that produce outputs with long and useful life spans, with a minimum threshold of \$50,000. It is funded by various sources of revenue that often have restrictions on how they can be spent.

Browse through each category to learn more about the projects proposed for this fiscal year.

The City of Anaheim proposes a five-year plan on capital improvements throughout the city, with the City Council adopting the first year of the plan during the FY 2018/19 adoption process in June 2018.

The City's largest project proposed for FY 2018/19 is the continued improvement of critical infrastructure and amenities found in the Platinum Triangle. These infrastructure improvements are funded with community district funds and will widen existing roadways to include sidewalks, parkways, and driveway approaches, curb and gutter, asphalt pavement, concrete bus pads, and raised landscape medians.

Projects will also provide improvements to traffic signals and public utilities, along with enhancements to sewer and storm drain facilities. These improvements will enhance safety, aesthetics, and traffic flows throughout the city and create the capacity to support future development.
