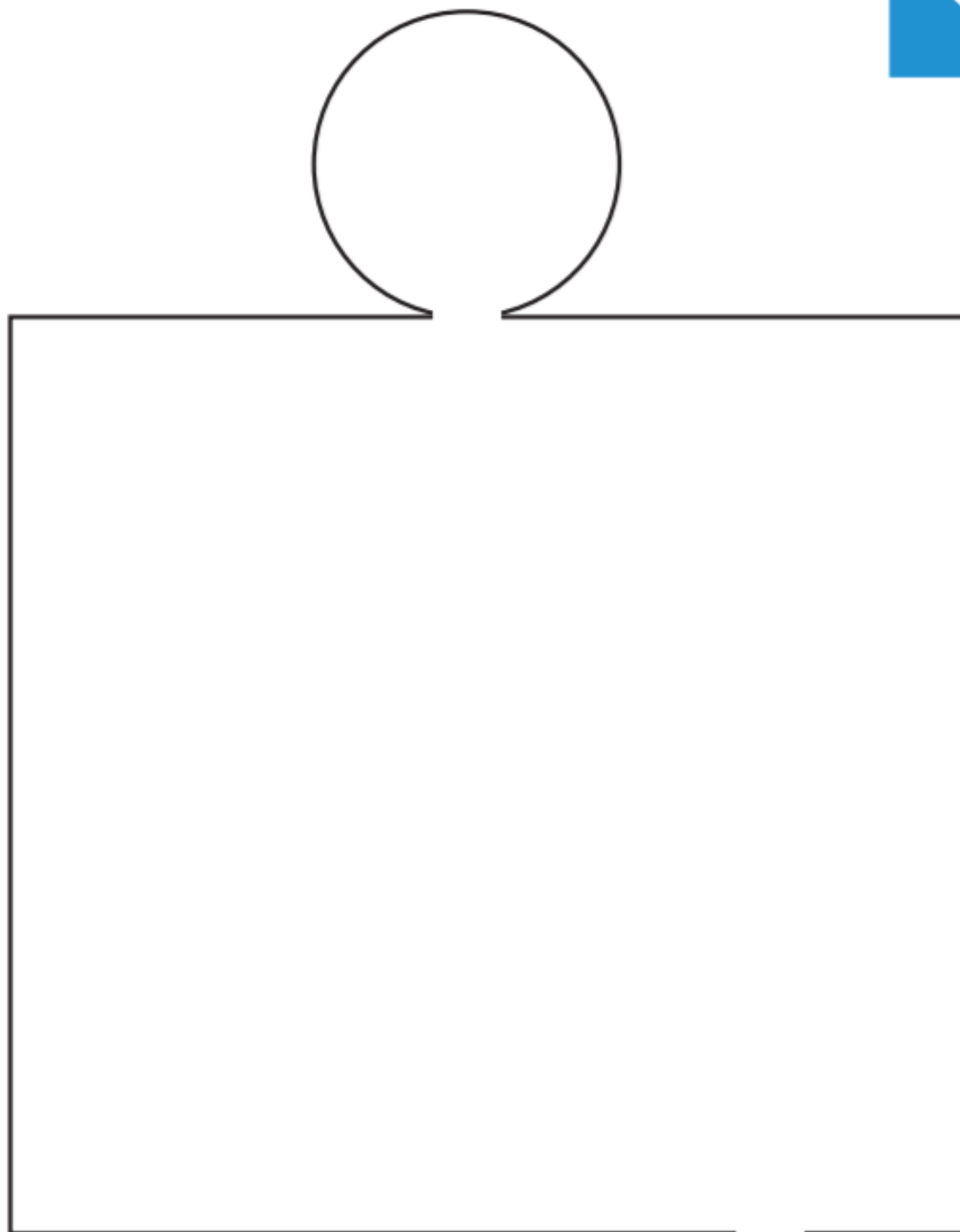


Make Canopic Jars

What were Canopic Jars?: Canopic Jars held four different types of organs: intestines, liver, stomach and lungs. Each organ was placed in a jar which had a specific god guarding it. Egyptians believed that the mummy would need these organs in the afterlife so preserved them. The only organ left in place was the heart. Ancient Egyptians believed that the heart held the essence or “soul” of the person.

Directions

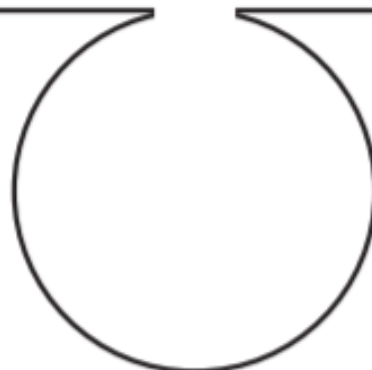
1. Using the template provided, color either one or a set of Canopic jars (the god(s), body part(s), and cylinder(s)).
2. Cut out organs, name cards and head(s).
3. Color and cut out cylinder. Tape sides of cylinder and bottom in place. Leave the top open.
4. Glue or tape cut out the god’s head to top of cylinder.
5. Glue or tape god’s name card in place
6. Place organ inside of Canopic Jar.
7. Repeat for others if needed.



Cylinder

3D Primitive Template

- ✂ Cut out shape along the solid lines.
- Fold until edges meet.
- Once folded, secure meeting points with tape.



Canopic Jars

The main organs are guarded by the sons of Horus:



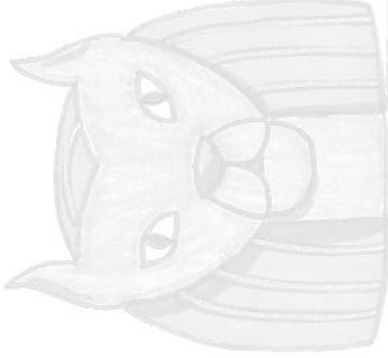
Hapy

The god with the baboon head protects the lungs.



Imsety

The god with the human head protects the liver.



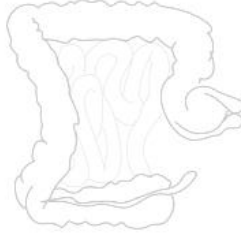
Duamatef

The god with the jackal head protects the stomach.



Qebehsenuf

The god with the falcon head protects the intestines.
