<p>What are you doing about porch pirates who are stealing delivered packages?</p>	<p>We have a very successful "bait package" program. If you are interested in participating, please contact the Anaheim Police Department at 714-765-1900.</p>
<p>I heard that the City Council passed a new ordinance giving the Police some new authority to go after street racing?</p>	<p>That is a great question! I will answer it live, but the short answer is we will be concentrating more on spectators, increasing fines, and towing vehicles.</p>
<p>In regards to the housing development proposal at 2960 W. Lincoln Ave., how many affordable units, at what level, and for how long?</p>	<p>There will be 100 affordable rental units at affordability levels between 30-60% of area median income for a 55-year period. There will be 120 market rate townhome units with 14 affordable for-sale units.</p>
<p>How many parking spaces for 100 units at the proposed development at 2960 W. Lincoln Ave?</p>	<p>There will be a 353-space parking structure incorporated into the 100-unit affordable housing project.</p>
