

#CaliforniansForAll Youth Jobs Corps

In partnership with local governments and community-based organizations across the state, the **#CaliforniansForAll Youth Jobs Corps** employs young people to help tackle critical issues in priority areas: **COVID-19 recovery**, **food insecurity**, and **climate action**. Youth are supported with at least minimum wage and essential wrap-around services like case management, résumé preparation, special job training, and other benefits to help ensure both their short- and long-term success.

#CaliforniansForAll Youth Jobs Corps has three core goals:

1. Increase employment for underserved youth across California.
2. Develop meaningful public service career pathways
3. Enhance local government capacity to address challenges in key focus areas.

Anaheim Youth Jobs Corps in partnership with Orange County Conservation Corps, Taller San Jose Hope Builders and Anaheim Union High School District is currently placing young adults between the ages of 16-30 with nonprofits that are actively addressing how COVID-19 recovery, food insecurity, and climate action is impacting the City of Anaheim. Paid internships are currently offered at: The MUZEO; Community Services/Anaheim Public Libraries, S.T.A.R.S/Fun on Wheels and Summer Day Camps; Goodwill Industries; Community Action Partnership of Orange County; Meals on Wheels/Adult Day Health Centers; AUHSD Community Schools/MACC farm, the iLab and Cambridge Virtual Academy.

Youth Eligibility Requirements

The **#CaliforniansForAll Youth Jobs Corps** prioritizes hiring youth who may not have access to traditional career-building resources. Priority will be given to youth applicants ages 16-30 who:

- Are in or transitioning from foster care.
- Are or were justice-involved.
- Are engaged with the mental health or substance abuse system.
- Are low-income.
- May have difficulty finding employment.
- Are unemployed and/or out of school.
- Have not participated in an AmeriCorps program.

Internship priority areas and job descriptions

Food insecurity Impact:

1. Work with AUHSD Community Schools and Family and Community Engagement: Staff to develop, implement, support, and serve Anaheim families by creating sustainable pantries that provide healthy options for our community members throughout our various sites. Establish, maintain, and create access to food pantries that will be available to support students and families across the district.
2. Work with AUHSD teachers at the MACC farm and the iLab along with our agricultural engineers to learn the following: Provide support to the farm with daily duties; learn and install proper irrigation systems; crop rotation; seasonal planting; organic farming practices; marketing skills; business entrepreneurship; preparing education for community members.

3. Work with Community Action Partnership of Orange County. Assist with food distribution at events and drives; Provide meals to food insecure residents Prepare food boxes for delivery to other local food pantries; Provide logistical support in the warehouse; data-entry at point of contact for client intake; provide assistance at the Giving Farm and Anaheim Independencia Family Resource Center.

Covid Impact:

1. Work with AUHSD to offer in person support for parents to complete the Project Management Google Certificate. Students who have completed the Google Certificate will work with AUHSD teachers at Cambridge Virtual Academy to develop, implement, support, and serve Anaheim parents in achieving a Google Certificate in Project Management; create, support, and implement modules to support parents in completing the certificate around the following objectives.
2. Work with The City of Anaheim Program(s) S.T.A.R.S/Fun on Wheels and Summer Day Camps. Duties include supervising youth, assisting with homework, crafts, games, sports activities and ensuring a fun and safe environment.
3. Work with the City of Anaheim Public Libraries. Perform a variety of clerical tasks related to circulation desk responsibilities, provides direct service and assistance for the public, or performs tasks related to technical services/collection support such as ordering, receiving, invoicing, and preparation of library materials for the public; and performs related work as required.
4. Work with the MUZEO Museum and the Cultural Center in their Guest Services area. Duties include front desk coverage, cash register operations, staff training, assisting with implementing new policies, and assisting with the reinstatement of the Membership Program at MUZEO.
5. Work with the MUZEO Museum and the Cultural Center in their community outreach department. Duties include working with curatorial staff to take on creating art projects for children, working events such as the weekly Center Street Farmers Market, reinstate the Docent Program, and create programming that engage and reflect the diverse communities of Orange County.
6. Work with the MUZEO Museum and the Cultural Center working directly with executive and curatorial staff to develop strategies for: supporting museum education programs, community engagement, publicity, and designing marketing and outreach materials.
7. Work with the MUZEO Museum and the Cultural Center working directly with executive and curatorial staff to perform all duties related to exhibition preparation. This includes installation, de-installation, packing/unpacking/crating of art objects, shipping, receiving artwork, coordinating necessary staff and materials, and the organization of art storage areas.
8. Work in an Adult Day Health Care Center. Responsibilities: Assist Activity Coordinator with social interaction and engagement activities; assist with clerical duties as needed, serve meals to older adult program participants, assist in staff before, during, and after meals; clean and tidy dining and activity areas through the day, other duties as needed.
9. Work with Goodwill Industries in Orange County. Various positions are available including Retail Store Associates, Administrative Office Assistants, Career Center Assistants, Information Technology Dept. Technicians, Donation Centers Assistants, Logistics (warehouse).

Climate Action:

1. Work with Orange County Conservation Corps in varies areas/locations including Coastal Live Oak Trees at Oak Canyon Nature Center; fire-fuel reduction in open space parks; assistance with tree care maintenance in Anaheim Parks; invasive vegetation control to prevent catastrophic wildfires; channel clearing to prevent flooding.
