Neighborhood Clean-Up Program

Overview & Procedures

Join your neighbors for some cleaning to make your neighborhood a better place! The City of Anaheim can provide large dumpster bins to your neighborhood once a year for FREE. The neighborhood clean-up program provides residents an opportunity to dispose of large items that do not fit in conventional trash containers.

Note: Due to the coronavirus outbreak, scheduled neighborhood cleanups are subject to postponement. We are closely monitoring guidelines from federal, state, and county agencies to provide you with the latest information. We ask residents to practice physical distancing by keeping a 6 foot distance from each other, wear face coverings, and refrain from interacting with neighbors if you are feeling sick.

The Neighborhood Clean-Up Program guidelines are:

Frequency:

Any neighborhood is eligible for a neighborhood clean-up once annually.

Logistics:

Dumpsters are delivered to specified addresses throughout the neighborhood on a Friday and picked up on a Monday (times will vary). Placement of bins is determined by Neighborhood Services staff.

Coordination:

Prior to and during a neighborhood clean-up, a resident volunteer will serve as the clean-up coordinator to work with Neighborhood Services staff and to recruit volunteers (preferably neighbors and other residents in the neighborhood) to help throughout the clean-up. Volunteers are asked to practice physical distancing and wear face coverings when interacting with other residents.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Clean-Up Coordinator:

The clean-up coordinator (typically the resident requesting the clean-up) will organize volunteers (minimum of one per bin) to monitor bins during the clean-up and assist in delivering flyers advertising to residents throughout the neighborhood. Flyers will be provided by Neighborhood Services staff. The clean-up coordinator will make sure all bins are being monitored throughout the clean-up timeframe to ensure that hazardous items are not being disposed of and that bins do not overflow.

Volunteers:

All volunteers must be at least eighteen (18) years of age. Volunteers should not assist residents with loading/unloading items being disposed of. Volunteers must be firm, yet polite in dealing with all who wish to participate in the clean-up. If an individual becomes belligerent, the volunteer should contact the Anaheim Police Department. Volunteers should contact the clean-up coordinator when bins become full in order to have them picked up by Republic Services. It is highly recommended that volunteers carry a cellular phone with them. Please remember that volunteers are asked to practice physical distancing guidelines and wear face coverings when interacting with other residents.

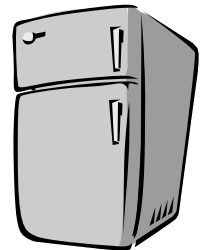
Neighborhood Services Staff:

Neighborhood Services Staff will provide the clean-up coordinator with flyers advertising the event and will coordinate the delivery of trash bins with Republic Services. Staff will provide the clean-up coordinator with program guidelines, bin guidelines, hazardous materials procedures and important contact phone numbers for their use during the clean-up.

Does the clean-up program not work for you? Consider another option to dispose of your items:

Bulky Item Collection

Only need one bin for your personal use or have a few items you wish to dispose of? To aid in the disposal of items such as furniture, refrigerators, stoves, water heaters or other items, Republic Services provides a FREE bulky item pickup service. Each household will receive up to three bulky item pickups per calendar year at no charge. These special collections are limited to up to 20 items per pickup, and are provided by appointment only. To set a date for a bulky item pickup, call Republic Services' Customer Service line at (714) 238-2444. Please be prepared to list the items you need picked up.
